


#### **Protection**



Ensuring protection for underserved communities is a vital necessity to survival and therefore a priority to MWL. We've been utilizing multiple methods to provide protection services, including cash for protection and protection by mine action.

#### Cash for Protection

Our Cash Assistance for Protection program functions in the protection sector of humanitarian efforts in 8 countries. The aim of this program is to increase protection and aid to those in need, particularly orphans and widows who are among the most vulnerable categories MWL helps. This program provides cash assistance that covers the cost of basic necessities, as well as physical and mental healthcare. Cash assistance is also provided for additional services that are determined based on demand.

- Seasonal food baskets



#### Child Protection

Children across the world who've been displaced due to natural disasters, economic struggles or conflicts, have been identified as a vulnerable group that could be at risk of additional physical, psychological and psychosocial problems that arise from their difficult situations. It is a prioritized focus of humanitarian organizations worldwide to care for children's physical and mental health. MWL is taking part in this mission by partnering with humanitarian agencies to conduct projects worldwide. Child protection programs MWL is involved in include recreational activities, structured and semi structured psychological support; and awareness campaigns that focus on subjects such as personal hygiene and education.
























The Child Protection Mobile team provides children in and out of the camps with safe identification, referrals and follow-ups to other available services (such as NFI, Health and Livelihood).












PSS activities included providing a set of structured animated videos to children and their caregivers that incorporated contextualized and culturally-sensitive language.








### **Shelter & NFI**

Shelter is one of the basic necessities of daily life; it gives families privacy and comfort; and provides security, shielding them from the outside elements. People worldwide who have been displaced and lost their homes due to tragedy and disaster have found themselves without adequate shelter. MWL provides tents and living quarters to Rohingya Refugees in Bangladesh. Shelters were implemented to expand shelter capacity and improve living conditions to help facilitate survival




#### Distributed Tents


### **Education**


During the Covid-19 pandemic, dropout rates have increased due to sickness, conflict and poverty; as well as loss of wealth and family. MWL works towards solving the global education crisis by implementing a variety of education projects, meeting the vast demands of basic educational needs, such as learning kits, rehabilitation schools, teachers' incentives, etc. Accelerated learning programs have also been made available as an option to disadvantaged children to provide them with equivalent educational standards to match their age. Children with special needs were served in all projects, maintaining equal opportunity for all children to learn.











## **Food Security**










### Health





# Program **WASH**






## **Seasonal Projects**


